Public Opinion on Maui: A Report for Hale Makua Health Services

KEY SURVEY FINDINGS AND STRATEGIC RECOMMENDATIONS

May 2021





Strategies 360 conducted a survey of 400 Maui residents between April 29-May 5, 2021.

- A combination of landline, mobile phone, and text message interviews were conducted to ensure greater coverage of the population sampled.
- ✓ The margin of error for a survey of 400 interviews is ±4.9% at the 95% confidence level for each individual sample. The margin of error is higher for subsamples.
- ✓ Other sources of error not accounted for by the stated statistical margin of error include, but are not limited to, question wording, question order, coverage bias, and response bias.
- ✓ When analyzing survey results by ethnicity, this presentation highlights results among those identifying as Caucasian/White, Asian or Pacific Islander (API), or mixed/multi-racial. The API category includes respondents identifying as Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Chinese, and Pacific Islander each of whom may hold distinct preferences, but do not make up a large enough proportion of the sample to allow for individual analysis in this deck.






- □ Though most are unaware of the oncoming demographic crisis, Maui residents place a high priority on caring for kūpuna. Over 9 in 10 say it is a high or top priority for the island to address.
- Residents widely approve of plans to improve and expand kūpuna services and housing on Maui; support exceeds 90% when described in general terms and holds at 82% when Hale Makua's specific vision for KCC Park is introduced.
- □ Hale Makua is very well known on the island and viewed extremely favorably. Framing the proposal as coming from HMHS boosts its support further.
- Residents' priorities for the vision include elements which expand access to kūpuna health and wellness services and build new housing that is affordable for kūpuna. Other services like skills training, sustainable food production, and outdoor recreation space are secondary priorities.
- □ Residents strongly prefer that the vision include space for the community's use rather than entirely setting it aside for kūpuna. This preference is shared across nearly every subgroup of residents.






There is a major opportunity to communicate about the impending demographic crisis, which many Maui residents are not aware of.


When thinking about the future of the County, would you say Maui's aging population is a crisis, a major problem, a minor problem, or not really a problem?





In assessing their priorities for the project, residents say it is most important to focus on caring for kūpuna <u>health / wellness</u> and <u>affordable housing</u>.

What should be included in new efforts to improve and expand kūpuna services and housing?

Responsibility

We all have a responsibility to care for our kūpuna. This proposal not only addresses their healthcare, food, and housing needs, but will give them a sense of purpose, allowing them to age with dignity and integrate them into an active, intergenerational community.

Future

Maui's senior population is exploding and we are currently unprepared to address their growing needs. We need to think longterm. This proposal will help us meet the needs of our kūpuna now and for generations of kūpuna to come.

Housing

Three quarters of Maui kūpuna currently live with family members. This proposal will create new affordable, safe, and comfortable housing for kūpuna who prefer to live among peers – and it will help ease the housing crisis for all of us by creating more housing supply.

Safety

The new community will be a safe and walkable area not just for kūpuna but for children and families. It will improve the surrounding neighborhood and help draw businesses and restaurants to Kahului.


Jobs

This proposal will provide an influx of good paying local jobs – both in construction in the short term as well as permanent health and wellness focused jobs in our community.

Tradeoff


While the benefits are clear, there is no doubt that the project requires tradeoffs and would change the look of KCC Park. To lessen any negative impacts, special accommodations would be made to help groups which rely on the current park so that they could find suitable alternatives.

All six frames resonate strongly; the strongest arguments go back to the fundamental goals of caring for Maui's kūpuna, today and in the future, especially by creating more affordable housing. Improving community safety and providing jobs are secondary benefits






Would you prefer that the community spaces to be built in the park be mostly set aside for kūpuna specifically or would you prefer they include areas intended to be used by the entire community?
